"The reason we do this," Endicott says, "is because research now shows that students who participate in instrumental music activities tend to do better in math, science, history, literature, international languages, reading, writing, even in computer science, in addition to what it teaches in terms of teamwork and self-discipline. These benefits should be available to all students. But for families that continue to suffer during hard economic times, even renting a musical instrument can be prohibitive. *Music4Life* helps them across the very first barrier they encounter, the acquisition of the musical instrument in the first place."

A new "Everett *Music4Life* Booster Club" is led by Deputy Superintendent Joyce Stewart and will be responsible for ongoing local fund raising to sustain the effort.
