

Dear Friend of Music4Life,

For many, Beethoven's "Ode to Joy" is a remarkable musical accomplishment. It is the embodiment of its name: "Joy." And so it is with our work for *Music4Life*. Theologian David Jeremiah has written recently that "a person who regards everything as a burden" cannot serve well. Those serving on the *Music4Life* Governing Board, the Advisory Board and many of its 11 Chapter teams agree: We do *Music4Life* joyfully to get playable musical instruments into the hands of students of families in-need. This helps all students because it gets more students into the community of musicians, which increases competition and promotes education. Better education means successful students. Successful students mean successful schools. Successful schools mean successful communities.

We've finished the past two years delivering several hundred ready-to-play musical instruments across 11 public school programs. Even so, we know we're just scratching the surface of what the real need is out there, given the recent pandemic and economy. My personal nightmare is the mother who wakes up crying in the middle of the night because she knows she can't afford even to rent a musical instrument that her child wants. That's why we're here.

So come along with us now as we report the successes and challenges of recent years.



# **The Pandemic Years**

In a world that tends to be dominated by a "What have you done for me today" approach, isn't it great to know that your investment in *Music4Life* opens the wonderful world of music to many students? That is true whether you've donated financially or with a musical instrument that can be repaired. What you're doing is investing in the basic education guaranteed to all by the Washington State Constitution.

Since our most recent annual report, ALL of us have gone through the pandemic. An awful time, hopefully now mostly in our rear-view mirrors. Still, we're all troubled by declining enrollments, declining school district budgets and reports of declining scholastic accomplishment by students subjected to remote learning.

During the two most recent years, Music4Life has delivered 556 ready-toplay musical instruments having a fair market value of \$243,752 to our 11 Puget Sound area public school districts. In addition are the 2,956 recorders (the little flute-like instrument that sticks straight out of the mouth) bought for third- and fourth-graders. The kids take a couple months to learn to play them, and then are invited to Benaroya Hall to play their recorders WITH the Seattle Symphony Orchestra. What a thrill! Also provided were many mouthpieces, bows, straps, harmonicas, percussion and other equipment we don't count as separate instruments but the value of which we do track for each Chapter.



### **About Our Financials**

On the facing page is a report of how we've shepherded your donations, whether you're an instrument donor, a government agency, a corporation, a foundation or one of our many individual donors. What it shows is that we use as many financial resources as possible to repair musical instruments that are donated to us by the hundreds of people who have them in their garages, attics or closets and who have gotten to the point of realizing that their highest-and-best use is to put them back into play.

What it also shows is that Music4Life helps support local repair shops and the skilled workers they employ. These local repair shops provide us discounts on repair costs first because of quantity: Music4Life ultimately agrees to the repair of 250 to 300 instruments every year. Many also realize that helping create more musical instrumentalists is a smart investment in their own long-term futures.

What it does not show is that 55-65% of all instruments we get are not designated by their donors for any particular public school district but "for use wherever there's the greatest need." This allows *Music4Life* to provide ready-to-play musical instruments to school districts based on the relative financial success of their Chapter teams. The more funds a Chapter team raises so *Music4Life* can pay for repairs, the more instruments and instrument values they receive. By the way, one of the most successful Chapters we have is also a Chapter that has the greatest local need.





### A Word About These Local Vendors


As of this writing, *Music4Life* works with Kennelly Keys Music (several shops headquartered in Lynnwood that includes American Music); Ted Brown Music (several shops headquartered in Tacoma); Hammond Ashley Violins in Issaquah; Raphael Carrabba Violins on Queen Anne in Seattle; Bandwright in Bellevue; Bigfoot Music in Arlington/Marysville; Mike Simpson Brass Repair in Renton; and Petosa Accordions in Lynnwood. We also enjoy the active support of Olsen Violins in Ballard and the Guitar Center in Seattle's U District. Other vendors are welcome to apply.



The average cost of repairing a musical instrument is about \$125-\$150. We invite — but don't insist — that instrument donors contribute this or any other amount toward the repair of the instruments they provide us. Repair costs vary all over the place, depending on whether you're talking anything from piccolos to pianos, of course.

### **Our Values**

There are now about 60 people who volunteer their time and creativity across all of *Music4Life* and its 11 Chapters. Some do it because they value "kids." Others want to support "instrumental music" at its very foundation. And still others want to enhance "education." Our abundant appreciation to each of them!
